Exciting online activities for children and families over the Easter holidays

CAMBRIDGE City Council's Children and Young People's Service (ChYpPS) have got the Easter holidays covered with an online programme of free activities for primary school aged children and their families.

ChYpPS have once again teamed up with Cambridge University Museums to give families the chance to explore their wonderful collections.

Family sessions on offer over the Easter holidays will range from learning about the small world of animal cells to looking at the vast night sky through a range of fantastic objects in the Whipple Museum.

The Museum of Zoology will test family knowledge with another of their fun quizzes and children will be able to get creative with ChYpPS on their Easter themed drawing sessions.

All the activities are designed so they can be done with limited resources families have at home. Sessions include:

- **Fun and games with ChYpPS**

- **Fossil drawing with the Sedgwick Museum**

1 April 11-12pm

For ages 7-11 - draw and learn about some of the Sedgwick Museum's fossils and how they might have looked when they were alive.



- **Scientific Women with the Whipple Museum**

7 April 11-12pm

For ages 7-11 – introducing some of the fantastic female scientists represented in the Whipple Museum's collection

- **Greek Gods with the Museum of Classical Archaeology**

8 April 11-12

For ages 7-11 - the museum is full of statues of gods, goddesses and heroes. Justyna will share her favourite statues and stories with you from the awesome setting of the museum.
