



## WHAT YOU CAN AND CANNOT DO IF YOU LIVE IN CAMBRIDGE

Current advice on what you can and can't do living in Cambridge under current Cooid restrictions

A <u>support bubble</u> is where a household with one adult joins with another household. Households in that support bubble can still visit each other, stay overnight and visit public places together.

<u>Meeting in larger groups is against the law</u> apart from <u>specific exceptions</u> where people from different households can gather in groups larger than 6 people.

The police can take action against you if you meet in larger groups. This includes breaking up illegal gatherings and issuing fines (fixed penalty notices). You can be fined £200 for the first offence, doubling for each further offence up to a maximum of £6,400. If you hold, or are involved in holding, an <u>illegal gathering</u> of over 30 people, the police can issue fines of £10,000. When meeting friends and family you should also: follow <u>social distancing rules</u> when you meet up; limit how many different people in total you see socially over any short period of time; meet people outdoors where practical. This is safer because fresh air provides better ventilation.
