
Romsey Mill can also offer assistance by putting you in contact with volunteers, who can help collecting shopping and medication.


## Latest infection statistics in Cambridge

Public Health England data indicates there were 52 new cases of Covid-19 in Cambridge, for the week Mar 24th to Mar 31st. This is a 24% increase from the previous week. This increase is likely due to a rise in the number of tests as children return to school. There were 0 deaths within 28 days of a positive coronavirus test in Cambridge. There were 3 new cases in Petersfield in the same week.



## Vaccinations

Total percentage of people aged 18 and over who have received a COVID-19 single dose vaccination in the UK, up to March 31st is 58.7%. The percentage of adults receiving the second dose is 7.8% on the same date.



## Coronavirus - Roadmap out of lockdown

As we have all enjoyed the easing of restrictions in the past week, we look forward to further freedoms, though not before April 12th.

Step 2 will see the opening of non-essential retail; personal care premises such as hairdressers and nail salons; and public buildings, including libraries and community centres. Indoor leisure facilities such as gyms will also reopen (but only for use by people on their own or in household groups); as will most outdoor attractions and settings

Book your swim now! Social distancing rules will apply, and you can swim for up to one hour

including outdoor hospitality venues, zoos, theme parks, and drive-in cinemas. Self-contained accommodation such as campsites and holiday lets, where indoor facilities are not shared with other households, can also reopen.

Hospitality venues will be allowed to serve people outdoors at Step 2 and there will be no need for customers to order a substantial meal with alcoholic drinks and no curfew, although customers must order, eat and drink while seated ('table service'). Wider social contact rules will apply in all these settings to prevent indoor mixing between different households.

While funerals can continue with up to 30 mourners, the number of people able to attend weddings, receptions and commemorative events such as wakes will rise to 15.


## Register to vote or update your details
